EPA NSW provided an update on their recent activity and focus areas for compliance. Dave Ingham shared insights of the recent Campbelltown incident and importance of learning from near misses. Matt Arkell from EPA NSW announced the EPA's intention to "raise the floor" of industry with their new TERP guide.

Tankers a major part of PBS as numbers continue to grow

Les Bruzsa from the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator provided an update on PBS to members at the NBTA General Meeting. Les announced there are over 16,000 PBS combinations approved and safely operating on our roads. PBS which Les Bruzsa often describes as his baby, has now grown with over 5,000 operators participating in the regulatory scheme 7 years ahead of predicted estimates. PBS is important to the bulk tanker industry with major operators and manufacturers benefiting from the productivity and safety improvements it offers.

The 1st of March marks the day to start using the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator's Generic Tyre approach and move forward with PBS and fit for purpose tyres. It's very rare that a regulator will receive a round of applause for implementing a policy, but that's exactly what happened when Les proudly announced to the NBTA that the transition period had ended, and the generic tyre approach is the only method for including tyres in PBS. A thorn in the side of industry and PBS has been removed, well done Les, Scott and the NHVR team... now onto access!

Members were able to speak with Scott Britton and Les Bruzsa, two regulators who get it, and tackle the big issue of access.
